A Thought from Mark...

Someone once said: "Wisdom is knowing what to do next, skill is knowing how to do it, and virtue is doing it." I think the Bible teaches most all of that! The only adjustment I would make from a Biblical perspective is to replace the word "skill" with "discernment" or "giftedness."

It is certainly important to know what to do next – and that indeed takes wisdom. I am always reminded in this light of the men of the tribe of Issachar, of whom it is said in 1 Chronicles 12:32 that they "...had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do..." They were wise men, in other words. They had a good grasp on what to do next.

To know what to do and to know how to do it are usually two different things. I may know I need to lose some weight, but if I have no clue what to eat and drink and what not to eat and drink, and if I am unaware of the need to exercise, then I can wish all I want but the end goal will never be achieved, will it? I think of the need in the first century to take the gospel of Christ to the Gentile world. God raised up Paul, who had a particular skill-set and life experiences to enable him to know how to do the task. Why did God not instead send James, or Peter, or anybody else? Because Paul was a specially chosen and prepared vessel (Acts 9:15).

Wisdom to know what to do, skill/giftedness to do it – both vitally important! But then there is something else, right? The will to actually do it, or, as our opening quote says it, the "virtue" to do it. Step 3 of this process is about integrity. I know what needs to be done, I have the God-given ability to do it, but then the question becomes do I have the will or integrity to follow through and do it? For me, James says it best in James 4:17 – "So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin."

This string of truths can be applied to a multitude of situations: obeying the gospel, reaching out to the lost, serving those in need, leading the church, worshipping the one true God, teaching children, giving generously – you name it. It is a pretty good grid to pass our decision-making through. Try it – it might help!

Dangerous Assumptions – Part 4

We have discussed three assumptions we tend to make about people's attitudes. Now I want to look at a couple of assumptions we tend to make that are really based on our own attitude. Either way it is important for us to learn all the facts about each person we meet and do whatever we can to touch that life and take them closer to a relationship with God.

Assumption #4 – Someone else will reach them.

We usually reach this conclusion in one of two ways. Either we have tried to reach out to a person and for whatever reason they have not responded favorably, or we learn of a person who needs the gospel, but we feel we do not have the time to do what is necessary to touch their lives.

There really are some people who, because of personality or other differences, you may not be able to reach. There will also be times when sickness or family problems keep you from having the time to reach everyone. But if you truly are in one of those situations, it is not enough to say, "Hopefully someone else will reach them." At the very least make sure that "someone else" knows about the situation and is put into contact with the lost soul.

On the other hand, there will be some people that only you will be able to reach. Of all the people they know and all the options they are being presented with every day, you may be the only one who can present them with the truth. You cannot just assume that someone else will step up. Make sure that you are not too busy with unimportant things that you miss your opportunities.




