Today I Will Share God's Blessings

Luke 21:1-4

Jesus looked up and saw the rich putting their gifts into the offering box, ² and he saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. ³ And he said, "Truly, I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them. ⁴ For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on."



The reference to widows in 20:46 provides the natural link to this story. The widow was rich toward God, but poor in man's view.

The story takes place at the temple treasury in the Court of the Women. In the Court there were thirteen trumpet-shaped vessels where worshipers would place their contributions. The rich who could afford larger sums would make a big show of their contribution.

A poor widow places two small copper coins, literally two lepta. Our English translations will typically call these coins "two mites." A lepta was one one-hundred-and-twenty-eighth of a denarius, the smallest coin in the Greco-Roman world. A denarius was minimum wage for a day's work. Despite the fact that many translations or commentaries will suggest that each coin is a cent, the smallest coin for us—a penny, it be more like fifty cents in terms of spending money today.

The widow puts in her last dollar, all of her *bios, life or better livelihood.* Jesus says she has given more than all the others. She gave all that she had. She trusted God to provide for her.


The measure of gift is not how big it is, but how much one has left. A gift is measured by the spirit with which it is given; giving is commensurate with means.

The story is consistent with a theme that runs throughout Luke's gospel, the great reversal, like the parable of the beggar, Lazarus, and the rich man. The one with almost nothing offers the most and is received. Those who offer the most are rejected.


