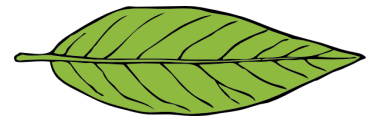

Just How Big is Your God

Despite the fact that I always planned to preach, my undergraduate degree was in math education. Because of that, numbers have always caught my interest. This week I ran across some numbers that were a bit amazing for Moses if he had had to figure out how to provide for the Israelites during their years of wandering. He was undoubtedly grateful that he didn't have to worry about this because the Lord took care of these matters.

Imagine providing for food for perhaps as many as 3 ½ -million people. Someone consulted the U. S. Army's Quartermaster General's office. They estimated that Moses would need 1500 tons of food a day, filling two freight trains, each a mile long. Cooking this food would take 4000 tons of firewood and a few more freight trains, each a mile long. This would be for only one day. If they only had enough to drink and wash a few dishes (no bathing), it would take 11,000,000 gallons each day—enough to fill a train of tanker cars 1800 miles long. Every time they camped at the end of the day, a campground the size of Rhode Island was required, 750 square miles.

God took care of all of this. He provided the food with manna and later some quail. He provided water from amazing springs.

So, just how big is our God?
