"I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account" Philippians 1: 23-24.

On this day that so many celebrate death as something to fear, we who have hope recognize it as something "far better" because it means we will "depart and be with Christ." This understanding comes as we study God's Word and obey the gospel but deepens as someone close to us who is in Christ transitions into His loving arms.

And, while we do it, perhaps we can strengthen the saved and lead the lost to the hope of the gospel. About death, are you living for Christ to be, as the KJV words it, "in a strait betwixt two"?


