Candace's treasurer was reading aloud from Isaiah 53:7-8 when Philip, urged by the Spirit, approached the chariot and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" And, thus, he evangelized. Office Hours

> Philip could have asked the man if he had received any literature from the church's mass mailing or if anyone from the church had knocked on his door in a recent campaign. He could have asked him to attend an upcoming event or invited him to attend the next worship service of the local body in hopes that he'd meet enough friendly folks to want to stay. Or perhaps he could have begun by debating with the eunuch about how baptism was essential for salvation or how his previous worship was wrong. No, but Acts 8:35 says, "... beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus."

> What? That was it? Philip just took the searching man where he was and brought him closer to God until he himself recognized the spiritual need that he had and asked, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?"

> The 25th of this month caps the 99th year of 36th Street's existence. And while the planning (join us at our 7 pm meeting on May 11) and excitement for our centennial celebration is building for a year from now, many can recall when our attendance was twice its current size and are concerned for the church's future, especially when those who celebrated our 75th are now 24 years older and don't have the energy or ability even if they had the time—to commit to another mass evangelistic canvassing of the area or extraordinary-event-to-end-all-events.
