### I Know Who Holds Tomorrow

Tomorrow we turn the calendar page into a new year. 2024 is our centennial year but never in our lifetimes has a year been



met with such uncertainty. Not only are sicknesses running rampant in an aging church, but the world around us seems to have gone crazy and is completely unrecognizable to what any of us remember.

Peter wrote in the mid-to-late 60s, just before he was martyred by Emperor Nero, to 1st Century Christians who were facing great persecutions by the culture around them. Apprehensive about an uncertain future, they needed Peter's assurance about the certainty of God's Word and control in a seemingly out-of-control world.

He told them in 2 Peter 1:19, "And we have the prophetic word more fully confirmed, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts." In other words, they could take courage because "I Know Who Holds Tomorrow."

This hymn's conclusion in the chorus gives us a way to stand firm and breathe easier in our trust in God while we struggle with so much uncertainty and spiritual chaos: *Many things about tomorrow, I don't seem to understand; But I know who holds tomorrow, and I know who holds my hand.* 

So, while those on the broad road that leads to destruction become brasher and bolder and our climb upon the narrow road that leads to life becomes a knife's edge and more precarious to stay upon, we can know that the same hands that hold tomorrow are holding us there. Let yourself be held this coming year as you pray more devotedly to Him and learn from His Word more diligently while serving Him more determinedly.

Let 2024 be the year that we feast in the presence of our enemies at a table that the LORD has prepared while we prepare a spiritual foundation for those who will follow us into the next century of His church here. May the day dawn and the morning star rise in your heart!
