Rich Enough to Wear a Crown

In Revelation 2, Jesus did not have great words for the church in Smyrna to praise them for what they were doing right like He did for the church in Ephesus. Neither did He admonish them for what they were doing wrong. Rather, He had empathy for their 'tribulation,' 'poverty,' and 'slander' that they had endured.

About thirty years before, Nero had ordered the burning of Rome and openly declared that the government's leader "wished the ruin of all things before his death." Finding that public blame was falling on him (who knew that would happen?), he blamed Christians, and a persecution began throughout the empire. Was it the past tribulation of Christians from Smyrna sewn into animal skins and killed by dogs? Or dressed in shirts of stiff wax, hung on poles, and lit on fire to illuminate Nero's garden? A persecution in which both Peter and Paul reportedly died?

Or was Jesus addressing their current persecution under Domitian towards the end of the 1st Century that had exiled John to Patmos where he wrote Revelation? Had some of the brothers and sisters in Smyrna fallen to the law that stated, "no Christian, once brought before the tribunal, should be exempted from punishment without renouncing his religion"? Or the turning of the pagan populace against them by blaming them for famine, pestilence, or earthquakes—which increased the number of informants to government officials. Or, arrested on suspicion of being a Christian, were martyred for confessing to this or refusing to take an oath of fealty to the emperor?

Yet, Jesus also called them "rich"—in treasure laid up in heaven, that is! As if the persecution they had already endured was not enough, Jesus says, "Do not fear what you are about to suffer." More was coming!

Their Savior also encouraged them with words meant for us as well, "Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life" for those who persevere (James 1:12) and "The one who conquers will not be hurt by the second death."

Are you "rich" enough to wear a crown?
