## Luke and the Jailer Rejoiced Together!

Often we focus on the account of the jailer that Paul converted on his second missionary journey but not the lesser figures involved. The author of Acts, Luke, who up to this point had to rely on *“eyewitnesses and ministers of the word”* (Luke 1:2) to tell him what had happened, joins Paul and Silas at Troas, evidenced by the first ‘we’ passage. Crossing over to Neapolis and Philippi, he could recount firsthand what happened with Lydia down by the river and the riot that caused the leaders of their group to be seized and imprisoned.

Luke, it seems, was among the disciples who weren’t seized and, therefore, had to hear the account after Paul and Silas’ release, perhaps from Lydia’s house before the group, minus Luke as the account then switches to third person once again, departed for Thessalonica. So, someone reported to Luke about this jailer, *“And he rejoiced along with his entire household that he had believed in God”* Acts 16:34.

A new Christian himself, perhaps Luke, a gentile physician (Colossians 4:10), saw in this fellow gentile, who had also believed and changed incredibly because of the gospel, a kindred spirit—though they were from different walks of life—and a reason to stay behind. Perhaps Paul’s reputation of ravager-of-the-church turned proclaimer-of-this-Jesus he had once persecuted had preceded him to Troas and the researcher and writer wanted to follow him after his own conversion? But, after witnessing how much Paul would have to suffer for Christ’s name before his terrified eyes, Luke remained behind?

Not forever though. Avoiding a plot against his life, Paul went back through Philippi instead, where Luke was waiting and joined the narrative (Acts 20:6). Had his time with the jailer, Lydia, and the church there come to an end? Or had Luke matured in his faith, so this first spiritual wartime reporter could face whatever would befall Paul? A clue is given to us in 2 Timothy 4:11 when Paul is jailed a second time and writes that all have left him but Luke. Do you lose your life to save it?
