'Ear Ye, 'Ear Ye, Read All About It!

Paul, who knew the depths to which his sin had taken him and the heights to which Jesus' love had brought him, saw Athens full of idols ... and "his spirit was provoked within him" Acts 17. Christians today find a similar situation in the world we must exist within ... but are our spirits provoked within us because of it? Does the existence of immorality and false teaching bother us, not for our own name and standing in the world—but for God's?

We try to avoid it or hide from it ... but do we confront it—wage war against it (2 Corinthians 10:3-5) like Paul did? His spirit was provoked because of the evil he saw, "so he reasoned in the synagogue with the Jews and the devout persons, and in the marketplace every day with those who happened to be there." Surely God doesn't expect that of us today, does He? The 21st century synagogues, where they might know something of the Christ, and marketplaces, where they know very little of Him, are very antagonistic places for the seed of the gospel to be sown.

Yes, but no worse than those of the 1st century ... and yet Paul still reasoned with them. That's what God did with the Jews turning away from Him in the Old Testament (Isaiah 1:18). And, that's what Jesus said to us so many times in the gospel accounts, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear." We need to get out into today's synagogues and marketplaces with God's Word, persuading others to the gospel with methods available to us today.

Never heard before, the gospel was "strange things to [their] ears." Some, whose "itching ears" didn't want to "endure sound doctrine" called Paul a "babbler" and "mocked" his message. But others said, "We will hear you again about this." Then, they "joined him and believed."

Provoked in our spirits because of the rampant idolatry and immorality around us, we must be zealous for the Savior who brought us from death to life and persuade the lost with the gospel.
