What Is Boring To You Is Exciting To Me!

A man traveling across Australia kept saying things like, "Wonderful!" and "Marvelous!" This was his response to the desolate parts of the continent. One of the other passengers who had made this boring trip numerous times could stand it no longer and asked, "Look mate, we are all bored stiff. You keep yelling and pointing. What is it with you?" The response was unexpected, "I was blind until a few days ago. I had an operation and now I can see everything. What is boring to you is new and exciting to me!" I am thinking many of us need an operation on our spiritual eyes. Do you agree? We have seen the marvelous things of God too often and they leave us bored to tears.

Our prayer should echo the words of Psalm 119:18, "Lord, open our eyes that we may see wonderful things in your law." God's Word is filled with awe-inspiring truths which are needing a fresh look by all of us. Familiarity is often the death knell to spiritual revival.

As Luke described the early church some wonderful and marvelous characteristics can be seen through the eyes of faith!
