This happens to all people – 100% - whether they believe in God or not – whether they have bent the knee to King Jesus or not. We are all being formed by something or someone.

Dallas Willard is quoted as saying: "*Terrorists as well as saints are the outcome of spiritual formation. Their spirits or hearts have been formed. Period.*" We might argue that "deformed" would be a more accurate description of what has happened to the heart of one who takes innocent life, but the point is well taken. It is quite a sociological study to consider the settings and sources of what warps the soul of terrorists or murderers or abusers or such-like.

Christians are interested in true spiritual formation. We remember the strained words of Paul to the Galatians – "...my little children, for whom I am again in the anguish of childbirth until Christ is formed in you!" (Galatians 4:19). Also, applied on a larger scale to congregations, Paul in 1 Corinthians 12 writes – "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body- Jews or Greeks, slaves or free- and all were made to drink of one Spirit."

True spiritual formation is from the Spirit of God. It begins when we are baptized and thus drink of the Spirit. It continues in the context of the body of Christ.

So, are you being formed?
