What is forgiveness? Simply put, to forgive is to pay the debt yourself. Sometimes I think we pretend to forgive... when we really just push down our outward response to the injustice. We just kind of bury how we feel and grit and bear it. But that's not forgiveness... that's always still in the back of your mind. It's always subconsciously affecting how we react and deal with someone.

We're not so good at forgiveness... we usually settle for this kind of forbearance thing... we're all a little like loan companies, I'm sad to say!

The thing about forbearance is, even though the debt is pushed down the line, it's still there. Out of sight - out of mind, but by no means remembered for the last time. The worst thing about forbearance is that during that out of sight time, it does something peculiar... it still gains interest. And so do our places of unforgiveness!

Have you ever heard someone say "I forgave you... but you know what, after all this time you NEVER even called. You never texted. You never even tried to contact me. I have forgiven you but you know what I will NEVER forget." Did you catch that? There's no real forgiveness there. There's actually MORE bitterness present than before. Because the debt wasn't forgiven... it was just out of sight. It just went into forbearance and it's been collecting the interest on all that time and bitterness ever since. Now the debt is too large for the person to ever even repay. The relationship is totally bankrupt. As we approach a new year, we ought to take time to consider that the forgiveness extended to us by our great God comes from a totally different stratosphere. We read in Hebrews about the superiority of Christ's sacrifice for us. Old Testament sacrifices were able to 'cover' the sins of the people for a time, but ultimately sacrifices were required continually to keep up the forbearance. Christ's sacrifice was different. It was once and for all (Hebrews 9:26). It has the power not to merely cover, but to cleanse. In Jesus there is no more debt to pay. It has been paid. We don't owe interest on our past, and we don't accrue charges that we must atone for in the present or future.

When Jesus said "it is finished". It was. As we enter 2020, may we have crystal clarity on what great lengths God has gone to in bringing us REAL forgiveness... and seeing as we have done nothing to deserve it, let us strive to extend the same grace, the same mercy, and the same forgiveness to others. Let's be finished collecting debts from people. Because God has paid ours Himself, all we owe...is praise.
