As I think about this morning's lesson on being a doer, I think about the scene from Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back where Luke is learning the ways of the force to become a Jedi Knight when he sees his star ship sink further into the marsh. Luke is convinced that he is now stranded on the Dagobah system until Master Yoda tells him to use the force to pull the ship out of the marsh. As Luke tells Yoda that he will give it a try, Yoda knows his heart is not in it and he swiftly rebukes Luke and tells him "NO, do, or do not, there is no try".

There's a reason why that line is one of the most quoted lines in all of cinema because it emphasizes that if we are to do something then we are to do it 100%. It's no secret that numbers have been trending downward just like Luke's ship was. The only way we are going to thrive again is if we are all hands on deck giving it 100% for God in every aspect that we can. God will not do it for us, we have to trust Him to give us the ability to do what we need to do and then we have to go out and do it.
