Why Study Romans?

A retired preacher in the Lord's church, my Uncle John, who baptized me into Christ twenty-nine years ago and helped perform my wedding eight days ago (perhaps some of you got to meet him), also got me started in ministry. While mentoring me, he said that Romans was a microcosm of the entire New Testament, and that if I understood it, then I'd understand God's entire plan of salvation. This was proved later when I came across "The Romans Road," a study that used just this epistle to teach the gospel.

Martin Luther preferred Romans to James, calling this letter "straw" as he believed it emphasized a works salvation, because he believed Romans supported the Reformation's "faith alone" doctrine. But ... Romans is full of references to obedience that results from faith, such as how grace is meant "to bring about the obedience of faith" (1:5) and how those who have been baptized "have become obedient to the heart" (6:17). This, of course, is what James is saying too, and so both inspired letters work nicely together.

So, in some ways, a deep and careful study of Romans will help you understand all of God's Word and will for us in Jesus, but it will also help us understand where many of our religious neighbors are coming from. You will be blessed by this journey that we start this morning that will bring us to the end of the year and won't want to miss a single class!


