36th Street Church of Christ (private Group) Perhaps you recall the 1998 movie, *Patch Adams*. The late Robin Williams played the title character who had patients doctor other patients. This is how the church should be like. Instead of a top-down model, where a small handful of Bible specialists and leaders struggle to serve a dwindling number of people, every Christian serves each other and the minister, elders, deacons, and teachers help steer the church in a biblical direction.

In the top-down model, the overworked staff ends up being reactive to issues that come up. This is where Moses found himself while judging the Israelites in the wilderness. His father-in-law intervened and God appointed a number of judges over His people. Then again when the issue of food distribution came up among the widows in the early church, the apostles appointed seven men to help with this struggle so they could continue with the ministry of the Word.

While our westernized understanding of medicine has placed a handful of doctors to minister to the masses, this thinking has come into the church, and Christians come 1-3 hours a week to be served spiritually rather than to serve the needs of others. We must all become the ones who seek the good of each other ... and then the church will grow.

A church that's proactive in proclaiming the gospel will have several efforts at reaching out that come from its members. The curriculum for children, birth through graduation, would be planned and teachers would see themselves as part of an essential ministry in their development. We invite all who'd like to develop this and serve in this way to a **teachers' meeting** (pizza provided) after morning service on February 26.

It's the members of a proactive church who minister to each other's needs. Rather than waiting for help to come from its leaders, Christians recognize that God "comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God" 2 Corinthians 1:3-4. The patients are the doctors.
