When our focus is inward, we tend to snap and snarl at each other and make major issues out of things of minor importance. But when we care more on how to seek and save the lost than on how to keep current numbers from slipping, we have a united, outward focus.

God's people at the time of Judges had slipped inwardly. We see this when the Ephraimites battle Jephthah's forces because they felt slighted by him. They were willing to let 42,000 of God's people to be lost from their infighting than be happy that Jephthah had conquered a common enemy with God's help. The last verse of that book says, "In those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes." Most likely this was written in the time of David, who was a leader that had led God's people back to Him.

In the church, we always have a Savior who has led us back into a right relationship with God. Because of Jesus, we never need to turn inwardly but can focus outwardly on serving Him and winning souls. In that way, we'll keep the church from going to the dogs!
