If There Will Be Peace and Security in My Days

Most parents would sacrifice or do anything for their kids. With my dad and two growing boys in the house, I know now that that's what my mother did when after dinner she'd say she didn't want dessert. And when my daughters became old enough to date, my dad wanted me to warn any potential suitors that their grandpa was "a crazy Vietnam vet."

But, how about generations beyond those you can hold? It's short-sighted and unloving to know that something you could do or not do now would affect descendants you'd never know decades into the future ... and you just shrug and mutter, "It won't hurt me."

That's where Hezekiah was towards the end of his life. Now, he had a great beginning when he trusted in God for the salvation of Jerusalem after the Assyrians had already carried the Northern Kingdom off into captivity. Of him, 2 Kings 18 says, "And he did what was right in the eyes of the LORD, according to all that David his father had done." Hezekiah wept and prayed when he heard he was going to die, and God granted him fifteen more years of life.

We don't quite know how he used that time, but it wasn't for the good of God's kingdom. Foolishly showing envoys all the temple and city's treasures, he was told that everything would be carted off to Babylon ... in the distant future. Hezekiah's response? "The word of the LORD that you have spoken is good," and "Why not, if there will be peace and security in my days?" And it wasn't in parenting as his twelve year-old successor would bring much abomination to God's people in his evil 55 -year reign.

But is that what we're about today? In a time when churches are 75% Boomers and less than 8% of Gen-Zs attend anywhere, are we shrugging and consoling ourselves with the thought that at least the Lord's church won't die in our lifetime? What could we do or not be doing to ensure that future generations will still obey and live out the gospel?
