The Bible says of very few that they walked with God. In the godly line of Seth, Genesis 5:24 says, "Enoch walked with God, and he was not, for God took him." Hebrews adds that he was taken that he "should not see death." To walk with God, then, indicates a close, intimate relationship with Him. Adam had that with God before sin separated him, as after he and his wife ate of the forbidden fruit, "they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day" Genesis 3:8.

Though seven others were saved on the ark from the global flood and through them God would repopulate the world, it is only Noah who is described as "a righteous man, blameless in his generation" and that he "walked with God" Genesis 6:9. And good thing—as "the LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. And the LORD regretted that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him to his heart" Genesis 6:5-6.

That describes the heart of man in today's world as well. So ... does is God's heart grieved? Though Jesus did not even claim to know the day or hour that God would judge the world, Christians today, shocked by the intensity of man's downward spiral into continual evil, would not be surprised to see that God would once again "blot out man whom I have created from the face of the land" Genesis 6:7, this last time by fire."

Where does this leave every one of us as "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" Romans 3:23? We are blessed to have the sinless Christ as a "Noah" for every generation. Only in Him do we find salvation from the destruction that will come upon the entire world. But with that, we must be careful how we walk—walking as Jesus did (1 John 2:6). His church must walk like Noah in this generation.
