For Such a Time as This!

Last summer when I worked on the schedule for 4th Quarter, I didn't know if we'd be in NY or TX for Thanksgiving or hosting family in our home, but I knew that either way that week would be busy and I should schedule others for the class and two sermons the following Sunday. Sticking around, I got to learn and worship from others' teaching and preaching and stumbled upon an encouraging observation from class.

It's found in Paul's request for prayers for himself after the armor of God passage in Ephesians 6. Though an "ambassador in chains," Paul doesn't ask for them to pray for his release but for boldness "to proclaim the mystery of the gospel." Paul didn't see his physical limitations as limiting his ministry. So ... neither are the belt, breast-plate, shoes, shield, helmet, or sword physical weapons for a spiritual war.

Far too often we look at age, health, or circumstance as limitations when Paul didn't even consider such earthly things. Reasoning that God was in control, he needed to use all God had given him for His kingdom. This is something that the early church didn't seem to get. Because even though they were in "earnest prayer" for Peter slated to be executed in Acts 12, they still "saw him and were amazed" when God's angel released him.

How about us? The future of God's people is as much at stake today as in the time of Esther when Mordecai told her that perhaps God had put her in the position of queen "for such a time as this." We have a church full of seasoned warriors who know the feel of their spiritual armor and use of their spiritual sword. And God has given us great opportunity this holiday season as so many are desperate for hope and are trying to placate themselves with materialistic and hedonistic placebos.

Who better to hold out hope than those who may be in physical prisons of a different sort than Paul but see opportunity for the gospel in whatever situation a good God has placed them?
